Poolhouse Construction Underway!

Thanks to a generous grant from the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, Crafton is demolishing and rebuilding the interior of the Crafton Pool Bathhouse. Work began on October 2nd. They've already come a long way! Completion is schduled for April 2024 to ensure the Borough has time to get ready for the 2024 pool season.

A few of the upgrades planned for the Crafton Pool Bathhouse include a family restroom, a new direct route to the pool, new showers, new toilet stalls, and a new reception desk. The bathhouse will have all new plumbing and mechanical fixtures. We are even picking the new paint colors now!

The upgrades to the bathhouse will also include improved access for those with mobility issues. The plan includes moving handicapped parking next to the building to help meet requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

The final round of work, finishing the concrete sidewalks approaching the building, is scheduled to be completed by the Crafton Public Works crew in the Spring of 2024. Crafton Borough Council and staff are excited to share the upgrades with the community in the Spring.

There will be a ribbon cutting ceremony prior to opening the 2024 season.

Crafton honored Clyde Baker on Sunday, October 22nd with a ceremony designating the property the Borough acquired earlier in the year as Baker's Acres. The vision is to create an expanded and improved trail along the property that currently serves as an unofficial cut from Parkview St. (off Crafton Blvd.) through to Woodlawn, parallel to the Busway. A plaque was dedicated and placed along the trail near Woodlawn Avenue, declaring the area Baker's Acres. Baker purchased the property along the trail in the early 1960's and he regularly liked to visit with his wife. His children also spent many hours enjoying the property when they were young. It is an honor to recognize Mr. Baker and his long-lasting impact in the community.



New Sign Up and Running

Crafton has a new digital sign at the park entrance on Steuben St. thanks to a generous donation from the Crafton Ingram Rotary. Lots of work and planning went into designing and constructing the sign. The base is constructed of bricks that have been recycled from brick streets. It was powered up in mid-October and has been displaying easy to read community announcements for all everyone passing by.

Council President's Message.....

As we wind down 2023 (already), Crafton is progressing forward with many projects and initiatives to make our community even better.

Since the last newsletter, we have quite a few accomplishments including:

- 1. **2023 Budget -** The Finance committee conducted a mid year assessment to the budget and the financials are on track as planned.
- 2. 2023 Road Paving Project Six streets (identified by Robotics, not including project work) were paved at a cost of \$289K.
- 3. Park Digital Sign The sign was placed in Crafton Park repurposing old bricks from our streets. Thank you to the Crafton Ingram Rotary for their generous donation for the sign.
- 4. **Garbage/Recycling -** Renewed contract for the last option year with Waste Management for garbage collection and recycling keeping the same terms (unfortunately with a price increase per the contract). We will begin looking at options for 2025.
- 5. **Pool Season -** We had another successful pool season with extended dates and hours based on resident feedback. Thank you to the pool and administrative staff for all the hard work!
- 6. **Inventory -** Our summer intern completed a complete inventory of street signs, shade trees, crosswalks, and military banners with condition and location noted. This information is being used to replace and repair outdated or missing items.

We are working on the following projects:

- 1. **2024 Budget -** Staff, Council, and Finance Committee have been putting together a fiscally responsible budget for Council approval on December 14.
- 2. Board/Commission Vacancies Filled all open seats except for 2 openings. Residents should apply on the borough website to get involved. There will be additional openings in 2024.

3. **Pool Bathhouse Renovation -** The final design was approved by Council and construction has begun. Completion date is April 1, 2024.

Our future projects include:

- 1. **Broadhead Sewer Separation Project -** This is a major project that will improve our sewer systems (as required by Alcosan consent decree) in addition to fixing the corresponding roads with \$4.7M in grants awarded. Council approved the final design with construction to begin in 2024.
- 2. **Strategic Planning -** Council and Staff will be working on a Strategic Plan to prioritize future community and development initiatives.
- 3. Grants Awarded DCNR Grant for \$39.1K for a study on the trails on Chartiers Creek, Busway, and Switchback.

As a reminder, Council meetings are open to the public, and I encourage residents to attend (2nd and 4th Thursday of every month at 7:15 PM) in person or via Zoom to keep up to date on what is happening in our community. If you have any questions about anything on the agenda or happening in the community, please feel free to reach out to me.

I personally want to thank the Rec Board, staff, and all the volunteers for making our Fall Festival one of the best events this year! We even attracted the attention of the local news. There is a lot of work that goes into planning and organizing our events, and it is truly appreciated. I hope to see everyone at the Celebration of Lights and Holiday House Tour (back from a 3 year hiatus). I wish everyone a safe and happy holiday season and continue to appreciate the opportunity to serve you.


Mayor's Message

Let's talk about driving safely and legally... The Crafton Police Department recently installed a Motorola Solutions License Plate Reader (LPR) on one of our units. It was purchased through a \$25,000 grant from The Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency. LPR has proven to be very effective in traffic-related enforcement. All of our Crafton Police officers have been trained on the technology and have been using it during their tours of duty over the last few months.

I was shocked to find out just how often these violations are being flagged:

- Expired vehicle registration
- Expired inspections
- Expired insurance
- Driving while license is suspended (all reasons including DUI)
- Unlicensed driver
- Driving with a suspended vehicle registration

Please make sure your license, vehicle registration, insurance, and inspection are in order. And please refrain from driving if your license is suspended or you are not a licensed driver. Or you may find yourself being stopped and having a citation issued, or worse. Above all, if you are stopped by one of our officers, please remember to be polite and to follow

Brick Streets Survey Results

The results are in! 292 people took the Brick Streets Survey during the eight weeks it was available. Of those, 281 are residents of Crafton, the rest visit or do business in the community. That represents about 5% of Crafton residents. Or, about 8% of households, assuming a relatively low number of multiple respondents from the same household.

The majority of respondents think the brick streets add charm and value.

Code Enforcement

It's easy to ignore issues on our properties as the colder months roll out and into the holidays and then to the slower cozier months beyond.

You might be dashing out to stash the trash in your cans and ignore the gathering mess from some of it being ripped open or blowing out of the can.

Or maybe your gutters are full of debris and then they fill with ice and pull away from the roof or sag down sending melting ice in waterfalls in front of your windows and water into your basement.

Or you get caught off-quard for the first snowfalls and don't have the salt or working shovel to clear your sidewalk. You might even still have residual weeds like Quackgrass or Crabgrass junking up your yard or tree lawn.

Whatever the case, please be mindful of your property and maintain it even in the colder months-especially the sidewalks.

According to the code, snow and ice are to be removed within 24 hours of when the snow or ice stops accumulating.

Two years ago people were walking on main roads due to sidewalks being snow-covered and icy. Let's all try to keep that from happening again!

The code is clear that trash/bulk waste are not permitted to accumulate on property. Trash *must* be kept up with all winter. Rodents do not hibernate and scattered waste is unsightly and bad for the environment, no matter the time of year.

Many things can still be repaired/maintained in colder months when contractors are slower. Tree pruning in February and March is another good example of maintenance one can do with success.



Welcome Borough Engineer Larry Keenan



Larry Keenan became Crafton's first in-house Civil Engineer on October 16th. Larry comes to the Borough from Colliers Engineering and Design where he spent four years creating land development plans, grading plans, coordinating with utilities, agencies, and contractors, analyzing and updating NPDES drawings (the plans for eliminating Pollutant discharges

into waterways-think Clean Water Act). Larry is both an Engineer and Construction Manager in Training with more than 15 years experience. He graduated from Penn State in 2008 with a Master's of Science in Engineering Management. He is also LEED certified in Neighborhood Development. Additionally, Larry is a certified professional in erosion and sediment control, municipal stormwater management, and Green Infrastructure. Larry's depth of knowledge means he hit the ground running, helping the administration manage several large infrastructure projects and working to streamline day-to-day operations.

Crafton has millions of dollars' worth of infrastructure investment projects in the pipeline spanning the next several years. Engineering costs for those projects, in 2023 alone, are anticipated to be appx. \$950,000.

Larry will be Crafton's expert professional engineering advocate on these projects and will help reduce costs, and more than pay for his salary, in some of the following ways:

- 1. Perform some work that would otherwise be done by our outside engineers (Gateway) at greater expense.
- 2. Analyze project plans and recommendations with an eye to finding more cost effective solutions and overall cost savings.
- 3. Closely monitor Gateway engineers activities and billings.
- 4. Research and apply for additional grant funding for borough infrastructure and development projects.



Senator Wayne D. Fontana Expansion of Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program

Currently, Pennsylvania homeowners age 65 and over, widows and widowers age 50 and over, and people living with a disability 18 and over can apply for the PA Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program. The income limit is \$35,000 a year for homeowners and \$15,000 annually for renters, and half of Social Security income is excluded. It's not too late to apply for a rebate for the 2022 calendar year as the program will accept applications through Dec. 31, 2023.

Beginning in 2024 for the 2023 calendar year rebates HB 1100 will raise the qualifying household income limits to \$45,000 for both homeowners and renters. This legislation also increases the largest basic rebate to \$1,000. Future increases in the income limit will be tied to inflation under this bill.

service calls, and EMS assists. Of the 361 responses, 121 have been EMS assists with the rest being fires or fire related dispatches.



To participate in fall leaf collection, please rake leaves to the curb/street prior to 6 am on your collection day. Curbside leaf pickup will continue through the early weeks of December, weather permitting. If the weather does not cooperate with leaf collection efforts, a notice will be sent out via SavvyCitizen to alert residents of any schedule changes. Leaves that are bagged in biodegradable/eco-friendly bags can be picked up by the Public Works Department. Contact the Administrative Office to request pickup.

Please be aware that the leaf vacuum equipment does generate "leaf dust," which is unavoidable. Leaf dust may accumulate on parked vehicles during the operation of this equipment. We sincerely apologize for any inconvenience this may cause.



Be sure to keep your sidewalks clear of snow!

Borough Code requires all sidewalks to be clear of snow within 24 hours of accumulation.
