To that end, the staff and I ask for your patience and understanding while knowing that we will attempt to rectify any issues as quickly as possible. We understand the frustration and overall stress that COVID has placed on every family – including ours – and again only ask for a little decorum if, and when you call into the office.

In conclusion, it is a pleasure to serve the Borough and meet so many fine Crafton residents. There are many improvements, whether started or on the near horizon, that I hope will make every resident proud to call Crafton home.

Community Vision Document

The Crafton Borough Planning Commission issued its first “living” vision document to set out its goals, ideas, and strategies to pursue the ideals of the Crafton-Ingram Thrive Comprehensive Plan and the recommendations of the Planning Commission for further promoting the preservation of local identity, contextual smart growth, and community cohesion. Starting in August, we will be introducing a series of open public workshops to share this content and gather ideas from you as we evolve our vision together.



Community Workshops

These workshops will be interactive meetings (anticipated to be via Zoom) and open to the public to brainstorm, document, and share ideas for where our community can go in the future and what projects to prioritize in the upcoming year. Park & Shade Tree Commission



Last fall you may have noticed a few individuals with clipboards inspecting the street trees. These students from Penn State were able to rate all the street and park trees in the Borough. Over the last few weeks you may have seen a lot of trees being removed, this is because many trees are no longer viable. As the Park & Shade Tree Commission, one of the next steps in the upcoming months will be to maintain and trim the healthy shade trees that are in need of attention. Additionally, we would like to start replacing some of these street trees this fall. The Park & Shade Tree Commission is looking for home owners who may be interested in having a tree planted. Interested residents should have a fairly spacious lawn that can sustain a tree that (we hope) will be there for quite a few years and should not be located under Duquesne Light power lines. Homeowners will also be expected to assist with watering and easy maintenance during the hot, dry summer days. If you are interested please alert the Borough Office with your name and address and we will follow up. We also ask that you connect with your neighbors, as it is easier to plant several trees on the same block at the same time. These trees will become part of the tree canopy that is so valuable to Crafton homeowners and our community. Crafton is a Tree City USA participant, and has been for 31 years. This makes us one of the longest municipal participants in Allegheny County. The Park and Shade Tree Commission is seeking to fill a current vacancy and asks that anyone interested submit a letter of interest to the Borough Office.

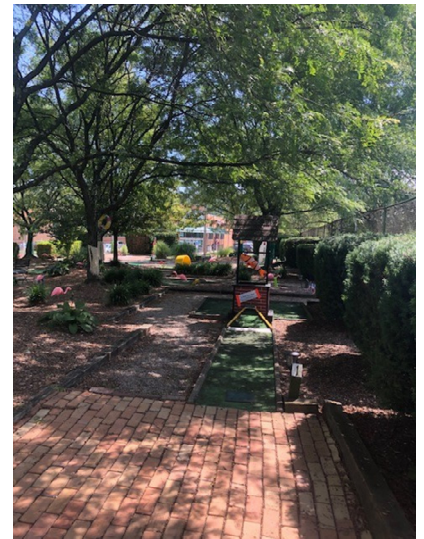

Equali-Tea party celebrated 100th anniversary of 19th Amendment

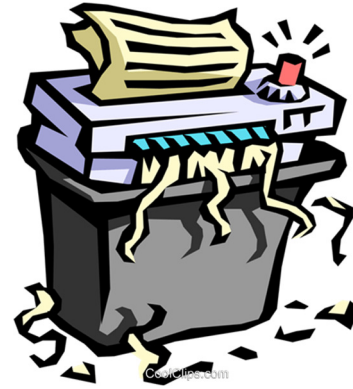

Code Enforcement Office

This year has brought its fair share of hardships. I joined in the pandemic lockdown by spending it at home like so many Crafton residents. This meant when things started up again for me in May, I had a lot of catching up to do in the Borough. Lots of people did home improvement projects which I was delighted to see. There is a level of satisfaction that comes with getting home projects finished and making your property look nice. I have seen all the lovely work residents have done and I have to say well-done!

There are, of course, issues that still persist and are a normal part of enforcing our codes and ordinances. There are always things left undone that need attention. It has been the policy of Crafton Borough to handle code enforcement with even more understanding during this time. This means more extensions and time to get violations abated as long as residents stay in contact with me.

It is a delicate balance to make certain codes are followed, but also that our residents have a chance to abate in reasonable time that takes into consideration financial issues out of their control.

Code enforcement is the front line in keeping our property values stable and keeping ourselves safe from preventable hazards.

Moving forward there are ways we can all be good neighbors:

- Make sure you get a building permit if you want to build something new on/in your house or an accessory structure like a shed, wall, garage, fence... (this includes pools 2' or over permanent or temporary—pools can be a real danger)
- Put your trash out after 4pm on Mondays
- Keep trash cans stored screened alongside or behind your house with a tight-fitting lid to keep critters out
- Trim noxious weeds and grass out to the curb
- Pick up dog feces and dispose properly. It attracts flies, and rats, even if you have dogs in your yard. I have seen it firsthand.
- Get a permit to have fires and be considerate to your neighbors as you burn
- If you rent property, make certain it is up to date with inspections and a rental license
- If you have elderly or at-risk neighbors check on them regularly
- Try to solve disputes with your neighbor before calling code enforcement, we are all in this together

If you see me when I am out and about, please feel free to say hello or wave. I know we can get through this tough time together as a community.

Allegheny County Side Yard & Blight Structure Program



For a limited time only, the Allegheny County Vacant Property Recovery Program will be accepting applications to acquire vacant properties for side yards to an owner-occupied primary residence or blighted structure remediation at a reduced cost to the applicant. Under the 2020 Side Yard and Blighted Structure Program, we will waive our standard parcel fee of \$3,000 for applicants for a side yard to their primary residence and applicants proposing to demolish a blighted structure. Additionally, they will reduce the fee to \$1,400 for applicants proposing to rehabilitate a blighted structure. All applicants will also be responsible for the appraised value of the property, a good faith deposit, and closing costs.

The application, which contains additional details about the Program guidelines, can be accessed at our website: www.alleghenycounty.us/VPRP. Allegheny County has announced that electronic submissions will be accepted this year via email to VPRP@AlleghenyCounty.us, as always, all required materials must be submitted at time of application. Applications MUST be submitted by September 30, 2020. Questions regarding the application process can be directed to 412-350-1090.



Building & Zoning Code

The following are Permits Required by Ordinance:

- Home Security/Alarm Systems
- Bi-Annual Residential & Commercial Fire Safety Inspections
- Dumpster/Storage Containers
- Zoning Use/Occupancy Permit
- Garage/Yard Sales
- Keeping of Chickens
- Recreational Burning Permits

The following are Permits Required by Building Code:

- Fences, Sheds, and Retaining Walls
- Replacements resulting in structural changes
- Swimming Pools
- Driveways
- Interior and Exterior Renovations such as; Building, Electrical, Mechanical, and/or Plumbing

Residents/Landlords **MUST** complete the New Resident/Tenant Registration Form within 10 days of change in occupancy. Make sure your employer has the correct PSD (730402) code for

Earned Income Tax Withholding.

Always contact the Building Inspector to ensure you have acquired the proper permits for your project.

Crafton Volunteer Fire Department

In September of 2019, the Borough of Crafton entered into an agreement with 4-Guys Fire Apparatus for the purchase of a new 2020 4-Guys Rescue-Engine with a Spartan cab. The new unit will have state of the art rescue equipment, including Hurst battery operated rescue tools. These tools will be able to disentangle and cut various metals contained in newer vehicles, as well as metals that are found in common building products. The 4-Guys Rescue Engine will not contain a generator and light tower, which is a savings of \$40,000.00. Additionally, this Engine was designed for grab and go type tools and lights, all battery operated and rechargeable. Moreover, we were able to connect with a resident of Crafton, currently employed by a tool manufacturer, who offered us deep discounts on all of our hand and power tools, which is an additional savings for the Borough of Crafton and the Crafton Volunteer Fire Department.

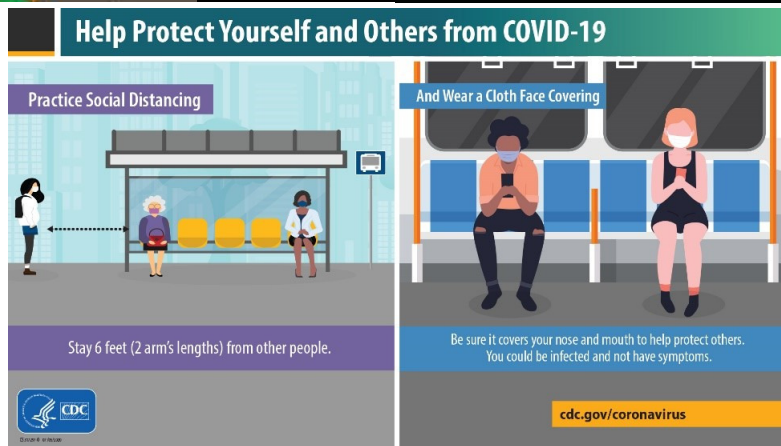
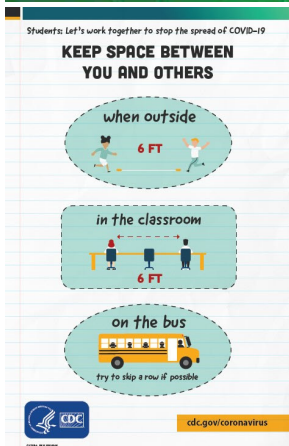

Back to School and Commuting Safety Tips

With students returning to school and employees returning to the office, the Crafton Police Department would like to share these helpful tips to keep all students and commuters safe.



Crafton Public Works

The current Crafton's Public Works Department includes six (6) full-time laborers and six (6) seasonal part-time laborers. Public Works performs a variety of maintenance activities for the Borough's public areas and infrastructure, such as street sweeping and plowing, leaf pickup, basic public sewer maintenance, and general facility repairs.

JUST A FRIENDLY REMINDER!

RESIDENTIAL LEAF/CHIPPING PROGRAM—Leaf collection service will begin October 1st and run through December 1st, **weather permitting**. Chipper service will continue until November 15th.

Residents are encouraged to notify the Borough with any service requests.
